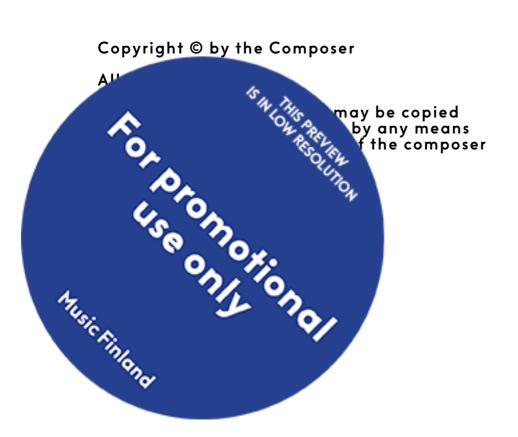

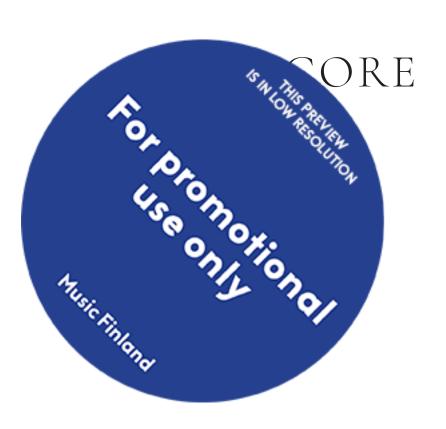

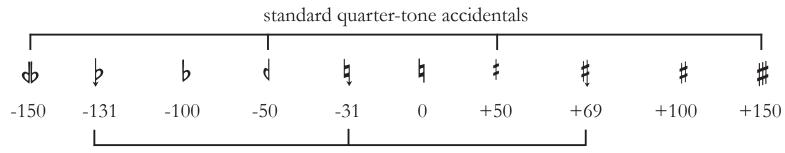

PERFORMANCE INSTRUCTIONS

The following **microtonal notation** is used (deviations marked in cents, 100 cents = 1 semitone):



used to indicate harmonic 7ths (7. partial in the overtone series), the pitch is ca. 1/6th tone lower

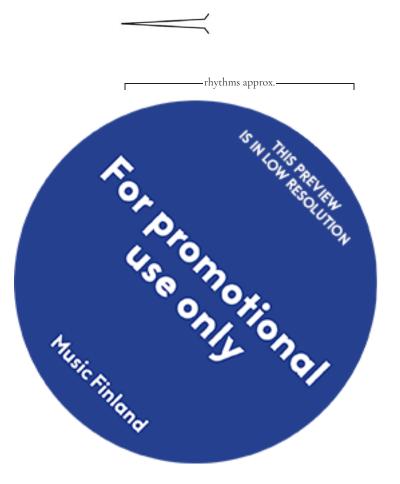
The piece contains some harmonies that are based on the **natural overtone series**. To help with intonation, some pitches that are justly tuned to the 7th partial, have been marked "7th / [instrument playing the fundamental pitch]", for example: "7th / Tuba".

Accuracy of **intonation** is crucial for the piece. The composer humbly asks the musicians to pay close attention to the different microtones throughout the piece.

The bpm **metronome markings** are absolute and for most of the piece, cannot fluctuate furing the music. The light design is programmed in seconds and for most of the piece, the players need to follow the light rather than the other way around. All parts contain the content of the light part in small staff for ease of coordination.

Dynamic marking in "quotation marks" indicate the intensity of playing / action rather than the actual volume produced.

Glissandi should start immediately at the beginning of the note and last for its whole notated duration.



Hairpins with a flared end indicate that the crescendo should increase towards the end of it and end with a burst of volume.

Bracket with the text "rhythms approx." indicates that the passage is part of a texture, where the exact rhythms is less important than the overall impression of multiple coinciding happenings. The notated rhythm is directional, but can also be played exactly as notated.

MUTES

For trombone and horn, practice mutes are needed. When practice mutes are used, the dynamic markings refer to the intensity of playing rather than actual volume produced.

For trombone, plunger mute is also needed.

Optionally, an additional kind of mute or object of the player's choice can be used to modify sound, creating a more metallic, and buzzy sound. (m. 23 - 40)

Other kinds of mutes and objects can also be used freely in the piece at the players discretion to realize the mood and timbre instructions as indicated in the score.

ABBREVIATIONS

non vib. no vibrato at all

poco vib. a shy, very subtle vibrato

con vib./vib. ord. natural vibrato, context dependent molto vib. a very wide and audible vibrato ord. cancels all special playing techniques

flz. flutter-tongue

SYMBOLS USED

Diamond notehead: play with air only, faint pitch should be audible. Trumpets sound approximately major 7th lower than fingered.

Diamond and normal notehead: sing upper note and play lower note.

Slashed notehead: make wet, smacking mouth sounds into the instrument. Think about eating lustfully. Can sound gross.



LIGHT DESIGN

The light design in Light Flowers consists of 6 layers: 5 spotlights (1 for each player) and a general lighting / colour wash layer, which are notated in the score. A separate light cue sheet is provided with the light cues and durations of light events calculated in seconds. Mostly, the piece is in 60 bpm to make coordinating easier.

Terminology used in describing the lights:

Blink: a short (usually 1 second) appearance of a spotlight that fades in and out. The blink can use timing that

resembles the following shape:

Flash: a camera-flash like quickly fading appearance of a spotlight or colour wash

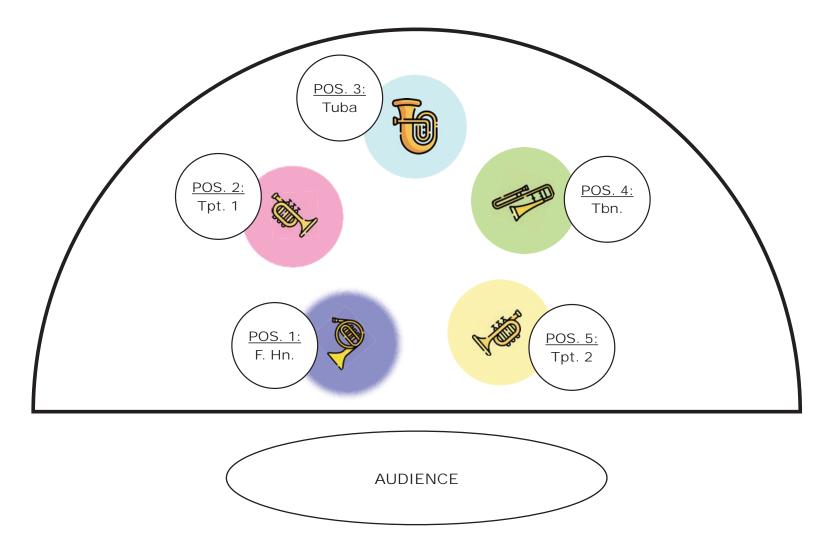

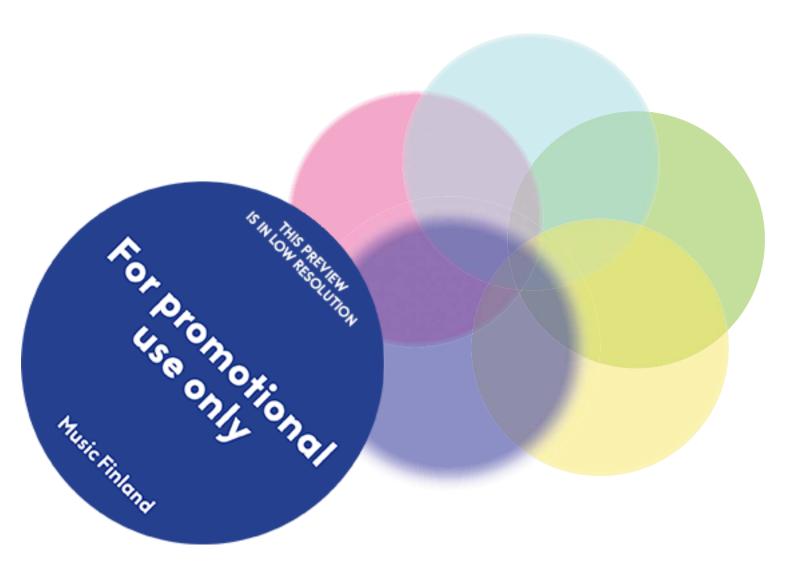


The colours needn't be exactly the ones shown above and can be adjusted depending on the light system and venue. Especially colours 1 & 4 should be clearly different from each other.

The following positions are regarded to as the "basic position".



In the end of the work, the spotlights should form a flower in the middle of stage, as shown below.

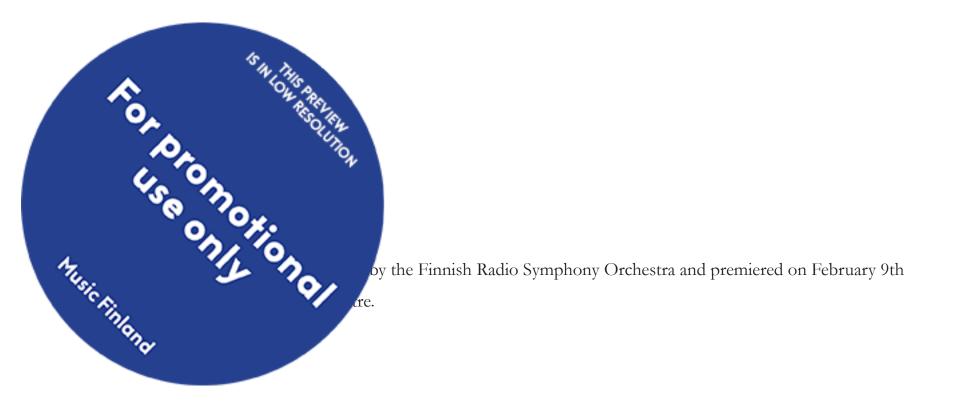

Taas muutaman kuukauden päästä narsissit puskevat kylmästä maasta.

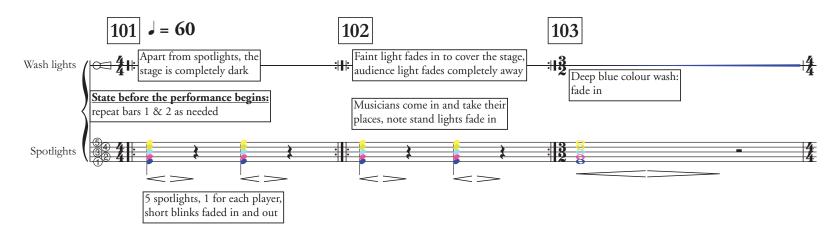

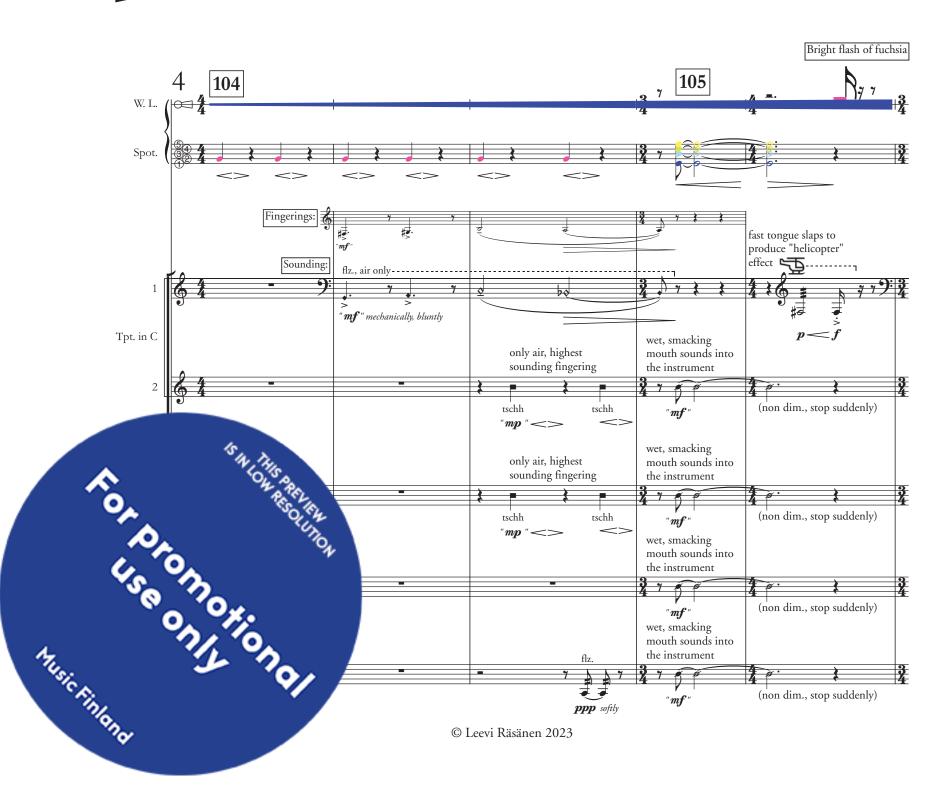
