

Variants and Deviants was composed for the Majaoja Percussion Competition.
The percussion instruments needed are as follows:



Notes to the Performer

There is a small line above the percussion part. This line contains some of the important sounds found on the tape. Not all the sounds are included, only a few to help the player stay with the tape.

The dynamics are mostly written, but the player must react to the actual volume of the tape. It is very important that the percussionist doesn't cover the tape, but on the other hand is not covered by it. Listen and react to what you hear.

The rim shot is played with one hand, not with stick on stick.

The set up for the percussion should be with the bass drum on the floor, the 4 other drums in a row across the top of the bass drum. The two cymbals can be placed somewhere above the tom toms. The set up uses a common drum set, and it is possible to construct the set up by using the two toms mounted on the bass drum as the middle two drums, place the floor tom to the left of these, and the snare drum to the right. You will no doubt need to find a way to raise the floor tom and the snare drum to the same height as the two toms in the middle but this shouldn't create a problem. If you have access to concert tom toms, by all means use them. In any case don't practice this piece on a normal drum set-up since in the competition the drums will be set up as explained above.

Lyömäsoitinstemman yläpuolella olevalle riville on kirjoitettu nauhalla olevia rytmejä.

Huomioithan, että kaikkia rytmejä ei ole kirjoitettu ulos, vaan ainoastaan tärkeimmät.

Sekä nauhan, että lyömäsoittajan soittovoimakkuus pitää olla tasapainossa niin, ettei kumpikaan peitä toista.

Soittimien sijoittelu on seuraava:
pedaalibassorumpu lattialla, tom-tomit ja pikkurumpu bassorummun yläpuolella (rivissä)
ja symphaalit tom-tomien edessä sopivalla kohtaa.

Jos käytössäsi on tavallinen rumpusetti, on tärkeää, että saat kaikki tom-tomit ja pikkurummun samalle korkeudelle,
sillä se on myös kilpailussa käytettävä asettelu.




