
Duration ca. 7 to 9 minutes depending on the length of the improvised solos.

UR (2017) for guitar and accordion has been inspired by the miracle of life. I had done some early sketches for a guitar-accordion duo commissioned by guitarist Jonne Grans and accordionist Matti Pulkki, but they became secondary when my son was born.

In labour, my wife started humming a steady tone of relatively low pitch in order to relieve the pain. I found myself adding an octave, tenth, or twelveth below her voice in order to do participate in a meaningful way. The experience was profound and mundane at once.

I soon met Jonne and Matti in order to test the acoustic qualities and instrumental aspects of the 'Ursatz' of what would become UR. The formal idea of recombination and improvisation in a rondoish framework was refined during pram walks with the newborn.

Each **Ritornello** begins with 8 bar recombination of fragments of the Puzzle.

The Puzzle, notated after the final bar line for rehearsal only, consists of 4-bar fragments. Each fragment of guitar may be recombined freely with fragments of accordion:



And these 16 combination fragments may be chronologically juxtaposed in any order, which gives 256 possible ways the Puzzle fragments may be exemplified in each Ritornello.

In performance, the musicians should not decide in advance which combinations to play, and in which order, but to choose spontaneously, ex tempore. Obvious enough, a fluent performance requires that the fragments are memorized.

**Recitativo 1** is an improvised solo of the guitarrist, accompanied by an accordion drone where new tones are added in four stages.

**Recitativo 2** is an improvised solo of the accordionist, accompanied by four arpeggios of the guitarrist.









## Without tempo: according to the natural pace of gesture





















Puzzle. Dynamics, articulation and timbre appropriate to context. Quite slow J = 70
