Performance instructions for After trace

General marks

“p”, “mf”, “f” etc. = Dynamics in quotation marks refer to the intensity of a performance technique
(Not to actually piano, mezzo-forte, forte etc.)

Fermatas: \wedge = short, \frown = medium, \square = long, $\overline{\square}$ = extra long

Accents: $>$ = medium, \wedge = hard

For the bass clarinet

Micro intervals: \sharp = 1/4- tone upward, $\sharp\sharp$ = 3/4- tone upward, \flat = 1/4- tone downward, $\flat\flat$ = 3/4- tone downward

= increase vibrato, = decrease vibrato, = increase and decrease vibrato

Z or Fltz. = Fluttertongue

\blacksquare , \square / τ = Toneless, play with the air-blowing sound

\blacklozenge = 1/2 -air sound
 \blacklozenge = 3/4 -air sound

smorz. = smorzando

+ = (over the note head) slap-effect

a.p. = approximate pitch

\uparrow = produce as high sound as possible

\vee \square \vee = inhaling and exhaling through the instrument

= movements of the lips

Bar 52 = partly free multiphone, only lowest and highest pitch determined

Bar 80 = key click sound

For the marimba

The marimba should be amplified with two microphones adjusted under the keyboard.

Mallets and other implements:

\circ = soft yarn, \oplus = super ball stick, || = saw-toothed stick

= pull at the edge of the key

= the mallet back-and-forth along the key (fast)

= “death stroke”; leave the mallet on the key after the strike

// salt. = saltando

= place the mallets on the keys as soft as possible, press the mallets against the keys

= back-and-forth along the keys (relatively slow)

= tip of the handle

= resonance tube

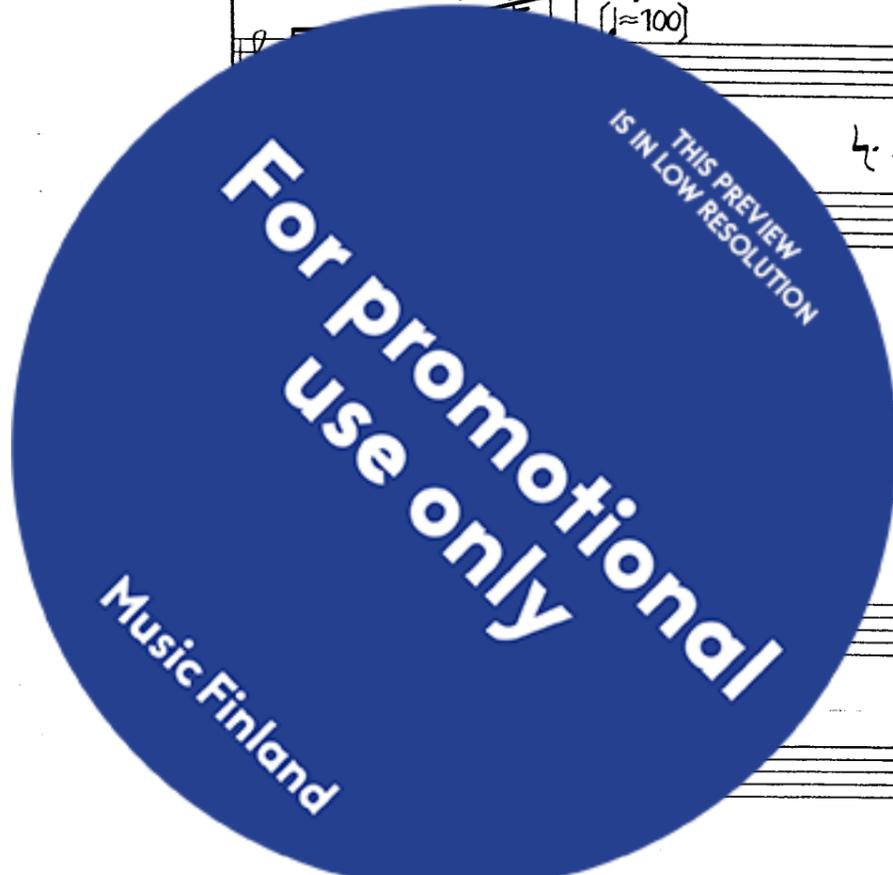
