APPENDIX

PAADAR is a lake in northest Finland (Lapland). The landscape of its area has been an inspirer for many artists - a world famous designer Tapio Wirkkala among others.

This solo flute piece may be combined with any poem or poems, depending on the soloist's opinion and feelings.

Technical points:

- *1 The flutist should mix consonant S with the normal embouchure, for producing a windy but audible pitch.
- *2 The soloist plays flute with left hand and a percussion instrument with right hand.
 Using an additional percussionist is not desirable, but tolerable.

Composers suggestion is a big concert bass drum, but smaller shell drums are available too. Even a cymbal or triangle (etc.) is acceptable, depending on the spirit of the combined poem.

If the stage is sounding well (wooden f.ex.), the flutist may produce the percussion sounds even with stamping foots.

- *3 Use the flute body as a mouthpiece of a brass instrument.
- *4 Use the flute body as a sakuhachi-flute, covering the tube end almost entirely with your lower lip.
- *5 In the very end play only quiet whistle tones with fingering E
