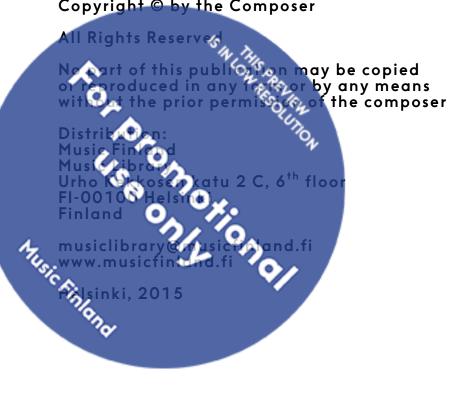

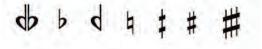

MICROTONES

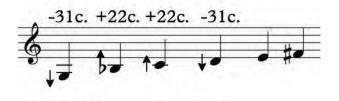
The following standard microtonal notation is used.



In addition, any accidental may be altered further with an arrow up or down. In this case, the further deviation is given in cents above the note.

-31c. +22c. ↓ ↑ ↑ ↑

Most frequently these alterations are: arrow down -31 cents ('*natural 7th*') and arrow up +22 cents, and apply to the following fixed pitches and their partials:



The section in bars 28 - 45 uses the harmonic partials formed by artificial harmonics, whereby the pressed finger constantly remains on a fixed fundamental (F# for Vn1 and Vn2, D(-31c.) for Vla, C(+22c.) for Vcl and Bb(-31c.) for Cb) and the lightly touching finger brings out partials 4. - 13. of the fundamental.

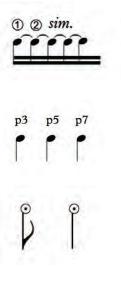
Below is a chart of the positions of the harmonics. For the sake of clarity, the exact touching positions above the fundamental are not given. Being so close to the pressing finger, they are impractical to notate. The resulting pitches can be discovered through listening and getting used to the position to find the resulting pitch.

WINDS

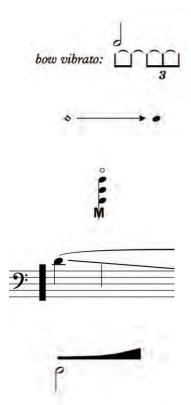


Timbral trill between two alternative fingerings of the same pitch. Slight microtonal variation in pitch and colour differences are expected.

TR. and TRB. with harmon mute Bring out the notated partial with the hand.



STRINGS



Bow vibrato, make bow pulsate within a single bow (change when needed) following the given rhythm.

Smooth transition between lightly touched harmonic and pressed note.

Multiphonic caused by sounding the multiple given harmonics simultaneously

Glissando with damped hand, slightly pitched noise. The given pitch marks the edge of the damped hand.

Increase bow pressure according to the black line, with a 'very slow bow' the same happens when making a crescendo without increasing bow speed.

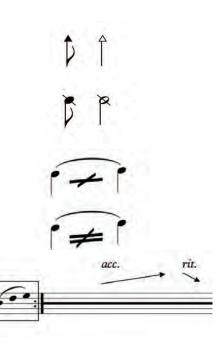
GENERAL

Highest possible pitch/position

STRINGS: half-harmonic WINDS: half-air

Irregular, free-flowing tremolo with the approximate speed of \rightarrow and \rightarrow respectively.

Repeat boxed figure until the end of the black line. Speed-alterations are independent of the rest of the ensemble.

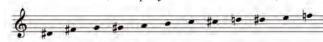

** The 'Holzkante' for this piece consist of is a thin but quite rigid wooden or plastic ruler, which hangs over the edge of a table. The bit of the ruler that hangs over the table is bowed either with a finely coarse friction stick (eg. flower stick), or with one that is more coarse, or even dented for louder playing, or finally with a bow to bring the pitch out best. The pitch is higher the shorter the bit hanging off the edge the table is. The ruler may also be bounced. Always hold the bit of the ruler on top of the table firmly at the edge so that it rattles as olzkantes should be slightly amplified, to bring out the sound of the tremoli and the inconspicuous pitch-changes d/or a contact mike. The rulers themselves may have to be slightly amplified as well with a contact mic, vel down as to not include unnotated sounds. Transo sing s Durse, c.
