Instrumentation:


Baritone Saxophone (equipped with Trombone mouthpiece*)

Bass Drum (eq. with two metal bead chains, Bass Drum beater, wooden drumsticks and wirebrushes)

- 2 Double Basses (with scordatura **)
- *) The Trombone mouthpiece should only be used, if the player cannot produce a satisfactory sound alone with the tube of the instument (with mouthpiece removed).
- **) Contrabasses to tune IIIrd and IVth strings to very low notes (unspecified, and in no way intonated between the two players), with the requirement that the string still resonates with great strength and very audibly when bowed **fff**, although the pitch may be ambiguous and the timbre unstable. >>the notation is tranposed, the IIIrd and IVth strings are notated as A and E respectively.

The notes of the Saxophone melody are written in the C-blues scale for notational reasons, but this can be transposed to whichever scale is most comfortable for the player.


 the notation is tranposed, the IIIrd and IVth strings are notated as A and E respectively.
- 1) during 2 beats, draw a full circle on the skin of the drum with a wire brush.
- 2) during 1 beat, rotate the instrument a full 360° starting with a sharp tap of the hand and finishing with a gentle stop (which is coordinated with the start of the other bass' rotation).









- *) wine glass with large bowl and a long, thin stem
- 1) hold wine glass by its leg and let the bowl rest on the front of the instrument (near the f-hole), letting it bounce freely.





1) pp, but loud enough for significant bouncing of the glass
