





in each group should be the following amount of singers: 7 soprani, 4-5 alti, 4 tenori, 4 bassi each group has 4 soloists (S-A-T-B) who are playing the following sound-producers in the mobile-section:

- strong paper, A small tubular chinese bell T very small gong, B strong paper
- cellophan paper A transparent paper, T small bell (with stick) B strong paper
- newspaper, A-small tubular chinese bell T-very small gong (different tuning) BL transparent
- small tubular chinese bell, A-small bell, T-cellophan paper, B-sistrum
- A maracas, T maracas, B small gong 5. group

the small chinese tubular bells can be taken from a chinese doorbell



woodwinds:

- 2 oboi
- 2 corni inglesi
- 2 clarinetti bassi
- 2 fagotti contrafagotto

All parts are written in theirs real pitch exept the Tenor and the double-bassoon, which be lower octave. are train




